The construction of these styles of boxes—at once similar yet very different from the clamshell boxes made specifically to house books—is a very important component of your bookbinding studies. Not only are bookbinders called upon to make all manner of boxes, they are also often required to repair boxes from the 19th and 20th centuries. Knowing how these boxes are made is key to understanding how they wear out and how to fix them.
